2019 Highlights

Give to Lincoln Day raised a record \$5.6 million through nearly 21, 000 donations to help 438 nonprofits.

Granted funds totaling more than \$17.8 million. This record amount was distributed to 1,099 nonprofit organizations with 87% of the grant dollars staying in Lancaster County.

NextGen Lincoln granted \$13,350 to local charities

- \$2,670 to Nebraska Appleseed, \$4,005 to Habitat for Humanity of Lincoln and \$6,675 to CEDARS Youth


